

Emergency Notifications

AtHoc

AtHoc is an interactive warning system that allows senior leaders to inform base personnel of urgent information such as Natural Disasters or any instance in which a warning is to be made. AtHoc will send out text messages, as well as phone calls to notify individuals of the event of concern.

Register by Following These Steps:

- On the bottom right corner of your desktop, click “^” and locate the white and purple globe.
- Right click the white and purple globe and select “Access Self-Service”.
- Click “My Profile” and select the “Edit” icon in the upper right corner.
- Enter all applicable information and select “Save” on the top right corner.

Hurricanes

Hurricane Conditions

(HURCONS)

HURCON 5: Sustained winds in excess of 58 mph could arrive within **96 hours**

HURCON 4: Sustained winds in excess of 58 mph could arrive within **72 hours**.

HURCON 3: Sustained winds in excess of 58 mph could arrive within **48 hours**.

HURCON 2: Sustained winds in excess of 58 mph could arrive within **24 hours**.

HURCON 1: Sustained winds in excess of 58 mph could arrive within **12 hours**.

SAFFIR-SIMPSON SCALE HURRICANE DESTRUCTION POTENTIAL

CATEGORY	SUSTAINED WIND SPEED		DAMAGE
	KNOTS	MPH	
1	64 - 82	74 - 95	MINIMAL
2	83 - 95	96 - 110	MODERATE
3	96 - 112	111 - 129	EXTENSIVE
4	113 - 136	130 - 156	EXTREME
5	≥ 137	≥ 157	CATASTROPHIC

NOTE: CATEGORIES 3, 4, & 5 ARE CONSIDERED MAJOR HURRICANES

Actions to Consider

Before:

-Bring in outdoor objects and anchor objects that cannot be brought inside.

-Turn refrigerator and freezer to coldest settings. Open only when absolutely necessary.

-Store drinking water in disinfected bathtubs, jugs, bottles, and cooking pots.

-Review evacuation plan and assemble emergency supply kit.

During:

-Listen to local radio or television for progress reports.

-Stay inside and away from windows, skylights and glass doors.

-Keep curtains and blinds closed.

After:

-If in a safe location, stay there until directed by local authorities that it is safe to leave.

-If you evacuated your community, do not return until authorities say it is safe.

-Stay away from downed power lines and report them to the power company.

-Report property damage to your insurance agent immediately.

Make a Plan

Prior to hurricane season, sit down with your family and create an emergency plan. Include a shelter plan, your evacuation route, and a communication plan.

Build a Kit

Having an Emergency Supply Kit will help you be prepared for any natural or man-made disaster that you may encounter. Account for your households specific needs.

Be Informed

Prior to, during, and following a Hurricane or Severe Weather, pay attention to all emergency information and alerts that a provided from SLD 45 and Brevard County Authorities.

Tornados

During a tornado:

-Go to the lowest level of your home or work. Take shelter in a windowless, interior room.

If in a vehicle:

-Never try to outrun a tornado. Get out of your vehicle immediately and take shelter in a nearby building.

-If there is no time to get indoors, get out of the vehicle and lie in a ditch or low-lying area away from the vehicle.
