L.I.V.E. Program Sessions are not your normal Diversity Training!



The L.I.V.E. Program uses mixed virtual reality to create an immersive learning environment where Airmen and Guardians can have real-time, authentic conversations with human-controlled avatars and other participants.

Realistic Scenarios

When you participate in a L.I.V.E. session, you immerse yourself in a safe, but **brave space** to practice addressing exclusion using realistic scenarios based on Airmen and Guardian experiences.

When entering a brave space Airmen and Guardians accept a level of discomfort when discussing personal perspectives and experiences, but know they are safe to share because the respect and dignity given by their fellow Airmen and Guardians.

The L.I.V.E. session and follow-on conversation is an opportunity for Airmen and Guardians to share personal experiences while learning to be inclusive, be informed, be courageous, and be equitable.





SUBJECT: Department of the Air Force Black History Month 2023

The Department of the Air Force is driving to create a more diverse, equitable, inclusive, and accessible (DEIA) culture across the enterprise to enable all team members to bring their maximum input to our competitive operations worldwide; DEIA is a readiness imperative. Part of creating and maintaining such a culture involves celebrating the communities with which our Airmen and Guardians identify; those from where they derive strength and resiliency.

The Office of Diversity and Inclusion invites you to attend the 2023 Black History Month (BHM) events being held at the Smart Center Auditorium, 1300 ET on both 21-22 February 2023. These events are open to all DAF, Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Coast Guard and DoD employees as we celebrate Black history as United States history.

The events are hosted by the Black/African American Employment Strategy Team (BEST), one of the seven DAF Barrier Analysis Working Group (DAFBAWG) teams. The BEST represents Airmen and Guardians of the Air and Space Forces and works toward identifying changes that will eliminate barriers affecting members within the Black/African American communities and their careers. The BEST encourages leaders to celebrate and learn more about the diverse cultural heritages of their Airmen and Guardians and how their communities have served our nation throughout our shared history. This year's observance of BHM will include hybrid panels, virtual Black history museum tours all year long, Living History Facts throughout the month of February, and video messaging with event participation from Air Force senior leaders.

The hybrid panels will be at the Smart Center in the Auditorium on Joint Base Andrews, Maryland. Both days will include a social hour at 1200 ET and main event at 1300 ET. Come prepared for dynamic guest panelists and lively discussions. The 21 February event will feature panels representing all seven DAFBAWG teams on *Mentoring*, *Recruitment and Retention*, and *Women's Promotion and Career Advancement*. The 22 February event will have opening remarks by CSAF, General CQ Brown, Jr. followed by a panel entitled *Celebrating Black STEM Achievements* honoring past and present military members and civilians who shine and empower the next generation. We invite you to attend both events in person or virtually (HERE via YouTube Live).

The virtual Black history museum tours will begin on 7 and 16 February. We will tour and highlight a new Black history museum throughout 2023 conducting one each month March-December. All virtual tours will be available via YouTube Live on the BEST Channel HERE. Subscribe to interact via live chat and see upcoming Black history museum tour dates and times.

The Living History Facts social media engagement will feature the lives, stories, and impact of several service members and civilians from across the Department of Defense and will be posted on the BEST Facebook page <u>HERE</u> throughout February.



Do you know January is National Slavery and Human Trafficking Prevention Month <u>and</u> January 11th is National Human Trafficking Awareness Day? During the month of January, emphasis is placed on creating awareness about human trafficking and the great human rights violation that it is. The real significance of the month has origins in the Emancipation Proclamation issued by President Abraham Lincoln on January 1st, 1863, which freed 3.1 million slaves. The Trafficking Victims Protection Act (T.V.P.A) of 2000 also made official the commitment of the United States to eliminating global modern slavery. Slavery and human trafficking are often considered a historic problem. Do you know there are more people trapped in modern slavery today than at any other point in history? At least 4.8 million people worldwide are trafficked for sexual exploitation and 4.1 million people are trafficked for forced labor.
